Where to go & what to expect

Do you have health insurance?



Yes:
Go to your primary care doctor or an in-network clinic (\$0-\$40)

No:
Start with a low cost option
(Free - \$50)

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC)
(AltaMed, Clinica, Neighborhood Healthcare)
(\$20 - \$60)

Retail Clinic /Urgent Care
(CVS Minute, Walgreens, Care Now Urgent)
\$50 - \$100

Important Notes:

- Skin test requires two visits (48-72 hrs apart)
- No insurance? Start at public health clinic first
- Tb Tests are valid for 5 yrs
- TB risk assessment (done by a PCP) may replace a test if no risk factors
